The Dr. Kingston Memorial Community Health Centre sponsored two Think Tanks which were held in March. Both were looking at the feasibility of developing a Centre for Well-Being of Seniors in the Richmond County/Strait Richmond area. This Centre is envisioned as one without a physical building associated, but rather a network of collaborators working together in many locations throughout the area to provide services and programs for, involving and/or led by seniors. One of the ways such a Centre could be partially financed is through the establishment of a 'Social Enterprise'.

"Social Enterprises are businesses owned by non-profit organizations, that are directly involved in the production and/or selling of goods and services for the blended purpose of generating income and achieving social, cultural, and/or environmental aims" (Social Enterprise Council of Canada)

Seniors Safety & Social Inclusion Coordinator



It is with pleasure that the Dr. Kingston Memorial Community Health Centre introduce our Seniors' Safety & Social Inclusion Coordinator Michele MacPhee.

Michele MacPhee has a university degree in sociology and experience working as a crisis support assistant/community outreach coordinator for a women's shelter. She has nonviolent crisis intervention, yoga and mindfulness based stress reduction certification as well as applied suicide intervention skills,

mental health first aid training and responses in situations of conflict training. She brings skills in facilitation, presentation, project coordination, negotiation, advocacy, teamwork and collaboration to this new position.

The Senior Safety Program is administered by the Kingston Health Centre, the NS Department of Seniors, RCMP and the Municipality of Richmond County. As Seniors' Safety Coordinator Michele will be a resource that seniors can contact if they have any needs, concerns or questions regarding their overall safety.

Michele will also act as Project Coordinator for our Chronic Disease Innovation Fund grant. This grant is held in partnership with the Strait Richmond Community Health Board. The purpose of this grant is to examine ways in which we can decrease social isolation and thus improve the health of Richmond County residents.

Planned and ongoing activities include safe driving for seniors, falls prevention, vision testing, increasing awareness of the effects of social isolation on health and the design of a wellness home model to integrate the health and social aspects of the lives of seniors.
